Dear Friends and Neighbors,

What a beautiful season it has been, and in Fitler Square we have been taking advantage of the gorgeous weather tending to the gardens and benches with some much needed TLC.

Maureen Chambley, our gardener extraordinaire, has reported that 29 of our mature shrubs were moved, all were pruned and shaped, hundreds of spring bulbs were dug up and planted this season, and most of the ivy and creepers were removed. She planted two mid-height trees, one in each garden, assorted groundcover and various hydrangeas.

Also included in the fall planting will be digging up and dividing hosta, planting flowering groundcovers, and, as many of you may have noticed, renovating the lawn.

As you may have noticed, a significant amount of work has been done on the Square - important tree work, wrought iron fence repair, and we purchased some desperately needed tools. All of this was accomplished at a conservative cost of approximately \$16,000.

Our gratitude and appreciation goes out to Maureen, and also, Pat Henningsen, our very diligent Grounds Chairman. Thanks must also go to Chris Henningsen, Pat's husband, who repaired the park benches, replacing the rotted wood and powerwashing them.

In reference to our 47th Annual Fitler Square Fair, Friday had to be one of the worst rainy days that I can remember in the 18 years I have been volunteering at the fair. The good news is Saturday was such a success that we succeeded in raising \$6,000. Thank you to all our neighbors that came out and supported this very important fundraising event.
