GET TO KNOW OUR BOARD MEMBERS: MARLENE BLUME, TREASURER

member of the Fitler Square Improvement
Association for over 40 years, Marlene Blume has
seen Fitler Square evolve into what it is today.
An original "Working Girl," she first moved to the
neighborhood in 1963 where she lived with two
roommates at 2515 Waverly Street. The Fitler Square
Improvement Association was just beginning to develop
the park at that time, and there was no grass, no fence,
and a lonely cement turtle.

In 1965, she and her roommates moved to 400 South 24th Street, and her next-door neighbor, long-time FSIA Board member and former president, Connie Williams, recruited Marlene to bake goodies for the Bake Booth and become more involved in the park. In 1965 another

important event in Marlene's life occurred; she met her husband Joe Blume at a New Year's Eve party at a friend's apartment above the Oliver Bair funeral parlor. At the time Joe lived at 2317 Delancey Street. They were married in 1969 and moved to their picturesque house on the 400 block of Croskey Street.

A member of FSIA since 1970, she has been Treasurer for 20 years, keeping track of our expenses and income, a daunting task that her fellow Board members will "not permit" her to retire from. While tirelessly volunteering on the Board during this time, and prior, from 1955 until 1999, she also worked full time in virus research, first at Children's Hospital and then at Wyeth

As I reflect on this past season, I remember how stunning Fitler Square and our surrounding neighborhood looked, everything iced over with soft white snow, the quiet beauty of it all. Unfortunately the ugly aftermath of the storms and cleanup was the price we paid for the serenity and convenience of city living, and they took their toll on our little park. We lost a large portion of our twin holly trees, the home of morning doves, the marble base of our beloved Bear statue had to be replaced, and we needed extensive masonry work.

We recently repaired all the damage and are working hard to maintain our east and west gardens and trees. As noted on our Website and Facebook page, we were one of three community parks to win First Place in the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society's City Gardens Contest. At an incredibly inspiring awards presentation attended by several of our Board members, we watched a slide show of the wonderful work PHS has contributed to many of Philadelphia's poorest neighborhoods, turning vast brown, barren plots of land and abandoned lots into viable gardens, parks and oases of green. We realized how fortunate we are to have the funds, through our membership contributions and Annual Spring Fair, to be able to maintain our lovely little Square.

We have spent over \$15,000 this year tending to the trees, gardens and grass alone. We also have other expenditures, including our holiday events that all the children enjoy every season and continues to develop into a great time to meet other neighbors and their kids.

As our 49th Annual Spring Fair approaches, we again face a volunteer shortage. This is our biggest money making event of the year. If you can help out and volunteer ANY of your time we would greatly appreciate it. I believe you will find the experience rewarding and fun.

Our Fair is always on the Friday and Saturday of Mother's Day Weekend, this year being May 7th and 8th, from 10 to 6 on Friday and 10 to 4 on Saturday.

I must also once again thank my fellow Board members, who work tirelessly to keep our neighborhood square the treasured place it is. Their names are posted in this Newsletter. Thanks, also, to our neighbor Tom McKeon who organized the Philly Clean-Up Day in Fitler Square. He and his volunteers swept and raked the entire neighborhood around the park. And I can't forget to thank John Petsinger, our neighbor who volunteered, along with Patty Fox, to paint our fountain while it is waiting for its total makeover. WOVEN TREASURES -A NEIGHBORHOOD TREASURE

It is very rare that one comes across a neighborhood like Fitler Square. Its culture, diversity, and overwhelming sense of community sets it apart from other large metropolitan neighborhoods. Parviz Yathrebi is one of the founding members of the community as it stands today. Yathrebi is the owner of Woven Treasures, one of the neighborhood's most beloved storefronts, where it is possible not only to procure a beautiful piece of woven art, but also to learn about your rug and its history. Fleeing Iran in the late 1970s, Yathrebi came to America to seek higher education, which commenced at the University of Pennsylvania where he took English as a Second Language classes.

Although educated at Penn, Yathrebi admits that he is self taught in the rug business, which he started from the inside of his car. As word got around, he opened Woven Treasure's first location on South Street in 1986. As the business grew, Yathrebi became more and more committed to not only finding the most beautiful rugs to offer his customers, but also to the communication and education surrounding the rugs. He understands the way that rugs are made, and can always spot rugs of the best quality.

Yathrebi uses his artistic talent not only in his work, but in his personal life as well. His love of books regarding rugs and the like has resulted in a large library of works in the back of the store. Not one to limit his artistic eye to one form of art, Yathrebi is largely educated in fine art in general, citing neighbor Frank Bender as one of his favorite artists. He feels that community and art have to work hand in hand, and is very generous in his contributions to many arts foundations around the city.

Walking into Woven Treasures, you'll see a piano. When asked why he keeps a piano in his store, Yathrebi will tell you that its sole purpose is to serve as entertainment for his annual Christmas party, where he employs a Russian pianist and belly dancers to keep his customers surrounded by art of all kinds. Food and drink too!

Yathrebi has been donating a rug to the silent auction at the Fitler Square Fair for over ten years. The members of our community are always excited to see the quality and design of the rug every year. Yathrebi's generosity is only one of his many philanthropic outlets.





At Woven Treasures, the customer gets treated like royalty. Not only will Yathrebi go out of his way to find the perfect rug for you, he is also able to recreate rugs from photos, and give your rug the royal treatment when it needs to get cleaned, repaired or appraised. In addition, you can find glorious jewelry that his wife sells in the store and also one of the best collections around of imported tiles and artifacts, also for sale.

Yathrebi and his wife, Maryam, are wonderful members of our community. Even if just for a chat about the beauty of our neighborhood, stop in and say hello the next time you are nearby.


