

# Kenyatta Johnson, our new Councilman "who loves us back"

For those of you who weren't able to attend our Jubilee in October, the highlight of the night was a presentation of a \$25,000 grant from Councilman Kenyatta Johnson to Fitler Square for bench replacement, which at this time has been increased to \$37,000 to cover all costs. We are so fortunate to now have a Councilperson who is sincerely interested in our neighborhood and is supportive of Fitler Square, emotionally and financially. His efficient and considerate staff return phone calls and follow up on any requests, including my inquiry to interview him for this newsletter.

Kenyatta Johnson grew up, and still resides, in the Point Breeze neighborhood, where he attended Childs Elementary School and Bok High School and Missionary Baptists Church. He attended Mansfield University and holds a Masters Degree in Government Administration from the Fels Institute of Government at the University of Pennsylvania. He also has completed the Governing for Non Profit Excellence Certificate Program at the Harvard School of Business. Additionally, he served as State Representative for the 186th Legislative District from 2009 until 2012, when he took the oath of



office for City Council.

It was during his attendance at Mansfield that he first felt the need to serve the community. He told me how every school break he would return home to find another friend murdered through gun violence. In 1998, when his cousin was shot and killed, his anger and determination to end gun violence resulted in the organization he founded, Peace Not Guns. It began with a prayer vigil and a peace march, and combating gun violence remains his passion today.

But the Councilman is passionate about a lot if things, including his new puppy, a blue concorso named Sasha Blue, and his beautiful wife Dawn, who accompanied him to the Jubilee. When I

Happy Spring, dear friends and neighbors:

2012 has been a great year for Fitler Square in many ways. We have increased membership to an all-time high of 338, we had a super successful Annual Spring Fair, and the year truly peaked at our Golden Jubilee party, where we raised over \$17,000 and Councilman Kenyatta Johnson pledged a grant to replace all of our benches.

There is a lot of work to be done in the Square and at the March Board meeting of the Fitler Square Improvement Association, as our Treasurer Marlene Blume gave her report, I was reminded of the U.S. Government signs that have sprouted up everywhere... "YOUR TAX DOLLARS AT WORK." So we came up with our own version..."YOUR MEMBERSHIP DOLLARS AT WORK." And here are a few projects currently underway in the Square:

#### Tree Work:

Pruning to remove all dead, diseased, and broken branches to improve health and reduce risk of branch failure. Remove diseased sugar maple tree in the west garden.

Plant two new trees..... Brick and concrete repair, Phase I......\$5,355.00 Ongoing Maintenance and Gardener costs......\$8,500.00

We are able to make these improvements with the funds we have raised through our membership and we have great plans to do more improvements in the future! And we are always concerned with safety in the square, so in the upcoming months, we intend to correct all of the loose bricks in the park, a daunting project since there is concrete underneath the brickwork that will need to be removed.

So please be assured that your dollars are spent for the good of the park and the community, and help us by attending and/or volunteering at our Annual Spring Fair on Friday and Saturday, May 10 and 11, our biggest fundraiser of the year.

On a final note, I would like to thank Philadelphia Parks and Recreation for their support, especially the plumbers and masons who are repairing our beautiful Victorian water fountain.

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

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#### **Park Stewardship Forum**

The Philadelphia Parks and Recreation Department held a Park Stewardship Forum on February 23rd 2013, to mark the 20th anniversary of the Park Stewardship Program. The program offered a chance to reflect on the present state of Philadelphia parks and plan for the future of the Philadelphia Parks system.

Presenters spoke about the history of Fairmount Park and how it merged over time with the City of Philadelphia Recreation Department. One of the keys to the past, present, and future is the hard work of volunteers and civic groups to support our parks.

The forum focused on connecting participant park friends groups with key park contacts (both at the Fairmount Park Conservancy and Philadelphia Parks



and Recreation). Love Your Park Week, from May 11th to May 18th was another topic and Parks and Recreation has chosen Saturday May 11th as a Service Day. There will be city-wide promotion of the event.

Participants in the Forum had two break-out sessions; one, to discuss general and specific problems relating to their parks, and a second, to think about future plans and how groups envision a future five years from now.
